Sam Parrish did a presentation on Home Theater. He pointed out the choice of projection TV or flat panel TV. If you have space and a tight budget, go for Projection. If you have little space and have the budget go for the Flat panel display. If you are going to use video games or computers, LCD is better than Plasma. Technology has improved such that LCD and Plasma are equally good for off axis viewing, that is, when you sit away from the center of the display.
