If you have forgotten your password or you never had one, click on the **Remind** button. This will e-mail your password to your e-mail address of record. If you never chose a password, it will generate one for you. You can then access the setup page and modify your e-mail address, your password and numerous other options. As you may know, some of the slide processing done by other companies was not up to the standards of Kodak. Bob pointed out that if the same color problem applies to a number of slides, they can be treated in a batch. In any case, batch or individually, almost any problem can be treated by scanning the slides into PhotoShop and letting "Autofix" do its job.

Don Jones led the group through some of the Titting gymnastics and other magical features of "Premiere Elements". In addition we reviewed "PhotoShop Elements 4" Organizer Tags. Emphasizing the ease with which it is possible to categorize one's photos for future grouping without having to create additional files.
