This months SIG included a repeat demonstration of **copy/paste** of a select area of your Desktop using **Irfanview** and **FastStone** image viewers. **Copy/paste** is a very useful skill you will use often.

Many computer users are replacing their old CRT monitors with the newer LCD monitors. It was recommended that you set your screen fonts to "**ClearType**." Microsoft states, "With Windows XP, **ClearType** delivers improved font display resolution over traditional anti-aliasing. It improves readability on color LCD monitors with a digital interface, such as those in laptops and high-quality flat desktop displays. Readability on CRT screens can also be somewhat improved."

A couple of new Microsoft **PowerToys for Windows XP** is the **RAW Image Thumbnailer/Viewer** and the **ClearType Tuner**.

November 6th, 2005 Main Meeting Review by Ray Miklas

Our main speaker was our friend, **Gene Barlow** of *User Group Relations* <u>www.usergroupstore.com</u> offering many more products this year for members of PC user groups and all at great discount prices.

Gene and Linda have been visiting SLO Bytes annually for several years now, offering great products and a presentation that usually center on data backup and hard drive recovery software.

This year, however, Gene's presentation covered four main groups of products:

1- Gene concentrated on **Security Products** <u>http://www.ugr.com/security.html</u> In particular. He covered *Invisus Security* package in depth. While all other security programs are sold as an off-the-shelf product, *Invisus* is the first to provide your Internet security as an ongoing service for \$14.99/month and give you all the security technologies you need for free. Gene also talked about *ShadowUser Pro 2.5*. This program provides easy to use desktop security and protection for Windows operating systems. ShadowUser accomplishes this using an innovative technology called ShadowMode. ShadowUser is the best way to prevent unwanted changes to PCs and laptops. The *Acronis Privacy Expert Suite 8.0*: Privacy Expert Suite is the most comprehensive anti-spyware and security suite that includes: a proactive real time protection against spyware, adware, keyloggers, and other malicious programs. There are also three WhiteCanyon products in this group consisting of *SecureClean 4.0*, *MediaWiper 3.0* is WipeDrive for Windows and *MySecurityVault Pro*. Gene touched briefly on each of the WhiteCanyon utility programs.

2- Gene also covered **Backup Products** <u>http://www.ugr.com/backup.html</u> of which *Acronis True Image 9.0* is the centerpiece of this group. *SmartSync Pro* is a universal solution to back up and synchronize your important data to SLO Bytes Hard Copy – December 2005 1

the same drive, different drive, network volume or even remote computer. An finally in this group is *Backing Up your Hard Drive*, an educational CD.

3- Gene also talked about **Organization Products** <u>http://www.ugr.com/organization.html</u> which include *Acronis Disk Director Suite 10.0, Laplink PCmover* and *Discovering your Hard Drive*, an educational CD. **Note:** See below where PCmover can be purchased for just \$19.97 to members of APCUG (SLO Bytes is a member of APCUG).
