

Show Your SmartPhone Images on Google Maps Pro with Irfanview

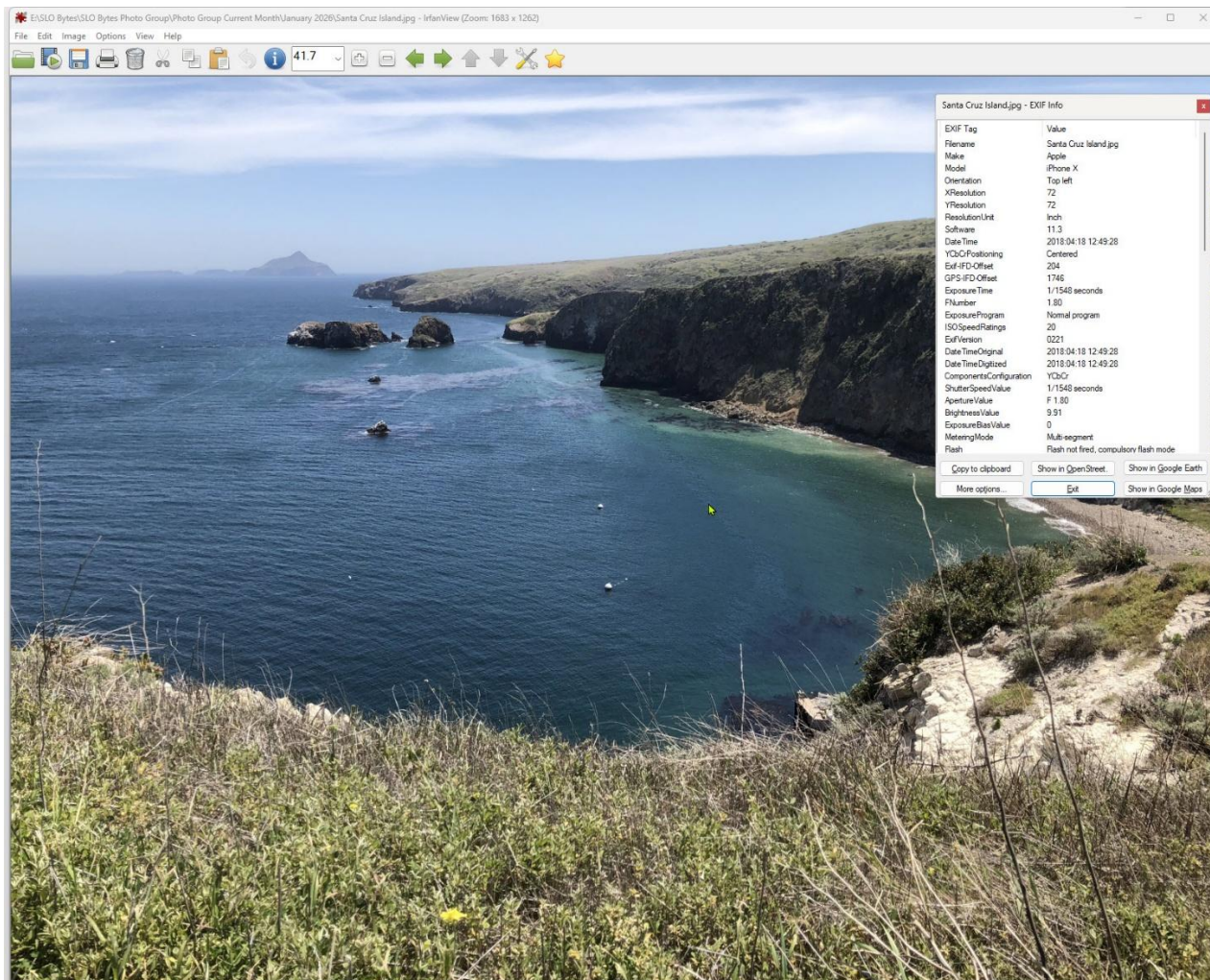
If you take pictures with your smartphone or camera that has gps enabled, you can place it on a map such as Google Earth Pro using the Freeware program for Windows, Irfanview.

Here is how.

Open the image in Irfanview

Press the **e** key

This will open the EXF data for the image.

Click on **Show in Google Earth** or any of the other maps displayed.

If you want to save the image to the Google Earth Pro,
Click **File/Save to My Places/Save my Places**

Save to my Places includes the image in your saved places. If you haven't saved any places previously, the appropriate file will be created automatically.

Next, click **Save my Places** to permanently save the image in Google Earth Pro
