Photo Group Report *by Ralph Sutter* Meeting of 03/16/2025 TOPIC: Photographer's Choice

Sadly, my dog Andy ate my Notes for the session and my memory couldn't recreate the presentations.



What follows is my effort to reconstruct the meeting from Zoom's AI Transcription

Ralph Sutter opened the meeting with a discussion of his latest toy, the Harvest Right Freeze Dryer.
